## \*1. What is the problem you are addressing and how much do you know about it? Is there a clear understanding of the problem within the college? What kind of evidence or data is currently available about the problem?

- -Professional development is siloed, underutilized, and not integrated. There are some promising practices such as inquiry groups and a newly hired director of professional development as part of the team.
- -No concrete data to understand the problem.
- -There is more we can do for the professional development.

## \*2. How does your team plan to address this problem? What strategies will you use?

- -Needs assessment
- -Research-based effective practices
- -Lit-review and gathering relevant information from other colleges
- -Faculty, classified, and managers will be collaborating with groups involved with current processes and structures to strengthen communication about and access to professional development opportunity

## \*3. What are your expected outcomes for your project?

- -Develop a clearer picture of professional development on our campus
- -Increase access and utilization of professional development
- -Improve communication about professional development
- -Build on what we do well and incorporate other best practices
- -Increase collaboration and more cross-fertilization among groups across campus and beyond as it relates to professional development
