Disabled Students Programs and Services is committed to providing students with equal access to educational materials.

- 1. Students are eligible to receive instructional materials in an alternate format provided they meet the following conditions:
  - E-text is needed in order to provide instructional materials in an alternate format for a student with a verified print disability that prevents him or her from using standard instructional materials.
  - The student is registered in the course at the college.
  - The instructional material is required or essential to the student's success in the course.
  - The student has submitted his/her request for alternate media and purchased the required instructional material.
  - The student will use the alternate formats solely for his or her own educational purposes and will nor copy or duplicate it for use by others.
- 2. Requests will be filled in a timely manner.
- 3. Whenever possible, materials are provided in the alternate format preferred by the student (i.e. Braille, audio, large print, electronic text)
