Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Heritage Month

Cañada College is celebrating AANHPI Heritage Month in April! Did you know that multiple resolutions were shot down in Congress to have an AANHPI Heritage Week? It wasn't until 1990 that Congress passed the recognition of AANHPI Heritage Month. May was chosen to commemorate the first wave of Japanese immigrants coming to the US, and the completion of the transcontinental railroad, where a majority of workers who laid tracks were Chinese immigrants. Cañada College is intentionally celebrating early in April to be mindful of finals and end-of-year celebrations. Cañada College is an Asian American Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution (AANAPISI) with 15%

Asian, 6% Filipinx and less than 1% Pacific Islander students identified at the College. Our students represent a diversity of ethnicities, identities, culture, languages and family stories. They are part of AANHPI community with more than 45 ethnicities represented in the United States. Cañada College is hosting events all month celebrating our diverse stories. As part of one of the kick-off AANHPI Heritage Month events, Cañada College staff, faculty and students participated in the 2024 Asian Pacific American in Higher Education (APAHE) Conference on April 3-5 at the Oakland Marriott. The AANAPISI ARC (Access, Relevance and Community) peer mentors presented along with CSM, Skyline and San Francisco State Peer Mentors on the ARC program and shared the critical role they have in student success through culturally responsive mentoring. The Office of Equity was able to attend the workshop 'Layers of Identity: Unpacking Southeast Asian Heritage' where we purchased copies of Ryan Samn's book Southern Chinese Diaspora in Cambodia. The book provides a resource guide to understand Chinese Cambodian ancestry and culture. These signed copies are currently available for anyone to utilize in the Cultural Center.
