a. "Why" We Do What We Do - 2.0

To ground our meeting and remind us why we do antiracism and justice-centered work, an SSPC member shares their "Why" – an uplifting (or challenging) experience (small or big) working with Student Services that reminds them why they do this work.

Maria Huning, "I worked on Saturday because I got amazing email from one of my students, who I had as an Upward Bound student and then I had as a TRIO student, that he just finished his last semester and finally his degree from SJSU in communications. This is a student who was told all the way from high school that he was never going to amount to anything and was never going to go anywhere. And here he is he got his degree and it's frame and he's all excited and this is why we do what we do! This is why we do it because he went from believing the high school counselors and the teachers and all the naysayers who were spitting in his face and we said, no, you've got this. We're getting you through using the resources that we have and we're making Cañada work for you. Then he had enough wherewithal to be able to find those kinds of resources at SDSU and finish and finish early. He was doing the smart thing by taking basic classes at Cañada at the same time and doing it online and it all counted towards his major. I'm super excited and really happy. He finally has all his paperwork and it was all free"

a. Planning and Budgeting Council

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PBC was held last week on Wednesday, 11/1/2023

The President approved two replacement positions for Math Faculty

There was a presentation by Karen Engel about the <u>ISER Steering Committee proposal</u> for Accreditation.

Steering Committee Composition:

Tri-chairs (one faculty, one classified staff, and one administrator) for Standard 1, 2, 3, and 4, Accreditation Liaison Officer, Accreditation Faculty Lead, Administrators as needed and College President.

The 4 standards are: Standard 1: Institutional Mission and Effectiveness Standard 2: Student Success Standard 3: Infrastructure and Resources Standard 4: Governance and Decision-Making

We had a presentation to discuss having <u>zero textbook costs</u> for our students. This would be paid using grant money to provide free materials and text books. There will be two pathways; early child education and mathematics.

b. Vice President of Student Services (VPSS) Updates VPSS 3

COLEGAS just had an amazing conference. This is our Latinx leadership system in the California Community College system and I highly recommend attending. They had about 600 attendees; standing room only and they sold out. It was very, very successful.

NCORE (National Conference on Race and Ethnicity) had their call for proposals. Deadline to register is in December.

In the spring please keep in mind that the African American Male Education Network (<u>A2MEND</u>) has their conference happening in March.

The <u>CSSO Leadership Conference</u> is happening March 12-15. The pre-conference is dedicated to equitable practices in counseling for Counselors which they've never done before.

Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in Higher Education (<u>APAHE</u>) Conference is happening April 2-5 in Oakland.

I mentioned all of these now because now is the time that you're either proposing something, which is another very secure way to get additional funding from your institution to attend these conferences or you're thinking about planning out your professional development funds for the rest of the year. If you plan to attend any of the conferences, I would like to know so we can build in time so you can share your story about attending.

c. Enrollment Services Committee Update (ESC) Wissem/Maria 3

UPDATE 11/3/23: The SSL Team went live with the College Alerts earlier this week which means students who have opted-in to College Alerts in the SSL Communications Preference Form will get texting reminders for things like counseling appointments. Everyone should make it part of their student interactions to get them to get into the SSL and Opt-in on the Communication Preferences form so we can have a larger number of student eligible to receive texting. Can we add to orientations? Marketing will implement their communications campaign to get students to opt-in and we'll modify some of the onboarding documents where recommended to drive them to Opt-in as well.

UPDATE 11/3/23: Initial Free College emails went out as expected on 10/18 to continuing students and is ongoing for new applicants.

NOTE: Marketing folks are trying to make our websites and communications more student friendly (i.e. using the brand "Free College") and moving away from not using what the legislation is called (i.e. SB 893).

1. **1st Free College Message:** Sent two weeks before registration begins for continuing students, and daily as new students apply. (The email below from Ari (and Claudia) recommends not sending the First Free College Message until after registration begins).

a. This message is resent when the student criteria changes to qualify for either Level 1 and Level 2. (For the student in the email below, they will qualify for LEVEL 2 once they register for more than 6 credits).

2. **2nd Free College Message:** For those qualifying for Level 2 (3Ts support), sent starting the 10th of the month of the start of the semester (August 10th, January 10th) and then once the student qualifies for Level 2.

3. **3**rd **Free College Message:** For those qualifying for Transportation support, sent starting on the 1st of the second month of the term and every month the student qualifies (September 1st, October 1st, November 1st, December 1st, February 1st, March 1st, April 1st, May 1st).

Question: I noticed there has been a lot of confusion about the messages being sent. A lot of the students who received the message two weeks prior about priority registration could not start enrolling because they don't have priority registration. Has there been any conversation about timing these messages a lot closer to the appropriate dates? Maybe we need to include in the message the actual registration date. We need to remember that a lot of our students have English as a second language and the vocabulary in the messages can be very technical.

Yes, we have a committee to specifically look at when to send the messages, to work on the timeline and to look at the language we use.

Question: I went with students in August to pick up their September gas card. Is this true for their February gas card? Can they pick it up in January?

From what we understand the gas cards can be picked up the second month of the period. If they're ready to be picked up in January, I don't know.

i. Membership & Drop for Non-Payment

Last year we brought the idea to SSPC about making this a permanent committee and we are bringing the proposal back to SSPC now as an action item. We're hoping you have had time to reflect on the discussion at the last SSPC meeting and are now ready to make a proposal to make this a permanent committee and to take action.

We'd like to discuss the membership and calling this committee an Operational Group who will report to SSPC. This group will continue the work of making registration easier. This group would not be making decisions or taking action. All recommending proposals would come to SSPC for action.

Membership Proposal

To create an operational group under SSPC with membership appointed by SSPC from various student services programs that includes the following members:

- 1 representative from the Counseling Division
- 1 representative from A&R
- 1 instructional faculty
- 1 administrator unless already representing another area
- 1 student (appointed by ASCC)
- May call on additional departments to support as resources

The administrator representation could come from one of the other representatives; for example; if Max was the administrator he could also take the seat as the Counseling Division rep.

The members of this group don't necessarily need to be members of SSPC.

Comment: There were questions at the last meeting about having a Welcome Center staff member and why isn't the group beginner? After much consideration we thought it would be better to have a more manageable size group (fast moving) and we'll bring back to SSPC all proposals and this is where everyone else's voice and comments can be heard.

In looking at the Compendium of Participatory Governance Bodies, we want to be clear this will be an Operational Group (Per the Compendium in the Participatory Manuel: Operational groups, for example, like iDeans or College Council, serve College functions or specific purposes related to college operations. Likewise, Professional Development (Article 13) or Evaluation Guidance Committees fulfill faculty contract obligations. They serve operational functions per the faculty contract. Operational groups are not college participatory governance planning committees.)
