UC Transfer Admission Guarantee

- Six of the nine UC campuses offer TAG; Students may apply for TAG to one campus only.
- The TAG application is available year round in order for you to plan ahead. However, you may submit it only during the TAG application period, *September 1-30, a year prior to your transferring*. You may create an account and apply for TAG by going to TAG Form Online at https://uctap.universityofcalifornia.edu/students/index.cfm.

Apply on time!

- The UC TAG information is available at <u>UC Transfer Admission Planner</u> and at the websites of each UC campus.
- It is highly recommended to create an account with the UC System during your first term at Cañada College.
- The TAG general policies are summarized in the **TAG** Matrix.
- You may apply for UC TAG at <u>https://uctap.universityofcalifornia.edu/students/</u>.
- Regardless of the UC TAG status, all students <u>must also</u> file a general application to UC campus during the application period, November 1-30, 2017.
- When applying for admission, please indicate your TAG submission on the UC transfer application and remember that your transfer admission guarantee is only applicable for the primary major you indicated on your TAG form.

General Requirements:

- Students must be enrolled full-time at California Community Colleges in fall 2017 and spring 2018 to be considered community college Transfer. Students with higher degree are not qualified for UC TAG.
- You must use full legal name throughout the UC TAG and application process.
- Students must thoroughly and consistently report all information on TAG and general application. This information includes all colleges and universities attended including colleges and universities attended outside of the United States, gaps in education, all grades including F, D, and incomplete, etc. All course work must reported as listed on the transcript and must also report non-transferable courses, repeated courses, courses with Academic Renewal, withdrew courses, in-progress, and planned courses in spring 2018.

General requirements:

- Students must be enrolled full-time at California Community College in spring 2017, fall 2017 and spring 2018 to be considered community college Transfer for UC Davis.
- Student must be enrolled in fall term at the primary /current CCC indicated on the UC TAG application.
- UC Davis TAG are accepted only for fall admission.
- Must meet the minimum GPA requirements by the end of summer 2017.
- Students may be enrolled simultaneously in high school and a CCC during spring 2017, but not thereafter.
- Enrollment at a non-CCC institution is prohibited beginning fall 2017 and up to the time of enrollment.
- Summer sessions immediately prior to enrollment may not be used to complete courses required for UC eligibility, the required UC-transferable 60 semester (90 quarter) units or any courses required for selection to the major.
- Complete 60 semester units by the end of spring 2018
- Both English courses must be completed by the end of Fall 2017
- Math course must be completed by the end of Fall 2017
- Courses required for selective majors must be completed with letter grade, with no grade less than "C" or satisfying the course by using AP or IB credit.

Unit requirements:

- Completed 30 semester transferrable units at the time of TAG application including AP/IB credit (by the end of Summer 2017)
- Complete a minimum of 30 UC transferable semester units at California Community by the end of spring 2018, **not including** AP and IB credits.

Minimum GPA and course requirements:

• College of Agricultural and Environmental Science = 3.2 GPA

The following majors are selective under this college that require additional GPA and other specific requirements (see assist for major preparation requirements):

- Biotechnology
 - Math 241 & 242 or 251 & 252 with a minimum GPA of 2.5
 - Chemistry 210, & 220 with a minimum GPA of 2.5
 - Biological Sciences 230 & 225 with the following GPA variances:
 - 3.00 GPA (B grade) if only one course is completed at the time of TAG
 - 3.00 GPA in a course or courses comparable to one UC Davis course
 - 2.50 GPA in courses comparable to two or more UC Davis courses

It is highly recommended to complete the biological course requirements before transferring. To be a stronger candidate, it is strongly recommended to complete Organic Chemistry equivalent to 118A/B/C (CHEM 231 & 232)

- Viticulture and Enology A minimum GPA of 3.0 in the following group of courses:
 - Math 16A 2(51 or 241)
 - General Chemistry 2A/B/C (210 & 220)
 - Organic Chemistry 8A (231 & 232)
 - Physics 1A/B 210 & 220 or Physics 7A (210+211 & 220+221)
 - Biological Sciences 2A (230)

It is highly recommended to also complete Chemistry 8B) 232, math 16B (252), and Plant Sciences (no comparable course at Cañada College). If these recommended courses are taken, must be included in the 3.00 course group GPA.

If at the time of TAG only one course of the sequence is completed, that course must be completed with a B or higher (3.0 GPA).

Pre-Landscape Architecture

Admission to UC Davis does not guarantee admission to the Landscape Architecture major. Students apply in the "Landscape Architecture, Pre-" category of the UC application. After applying for admission, submit a separate portfolio application to the Landscape Architecture program in February, either before or after enrolment at UC Davis. Contact the Landscape Architecture Advising Office at 530-754-8628 or visit the Department of Human Ecology for details about the portfolio.

• College of Biological Sciences = 3.2 GPA

All majors in the College of Biological Sciences are selective and require preparatory coursework for admission.

- All selective major courses must be taken for a letter grade, with no grade less than a C.
- Students must complete the following courses by the end of Spring 2018 with a have a minimum GPA of 2.5 in each group:
 - o Math 21A/B (251, 252)
 - Chemistry 2A/B (210, 220)
 - Biology 2A/B/C (225, 230)
- If at the time of TAG only one course of the above sequences is completed, that course must be completed with a B minus (B-) grade or higher.
- Biochemistry and Molecular Biology majors should also complete Organic Chemistry equivalent to 118A/B/C
- Marine Ecology and organismal Biology majors should also complete Organic Chemistry equivalent to 8A/B
 - CHEM 231 and 232 are articulated with 118 A/B and 8 A/B See <u>www.assist.org</u>.

• College of Engineering = 3.3 GPA

All majors in college of Engineering are selective. Students must take comparable to those course listed in ASSIST if offered at California Community Colleges and complete them with letter grade of "C" or higher. Take courses in selective majors for letter grade. A minimum **GPA of 3.2** is required for courses in selective majors. See the web page: "<u>Requirements in the College of Engineering</u>" and <u>www.assist.org</u> for course requirements for each major.

Complete **ALL** required <u>preparatory course work</u> by the end of spring 2018 for the following Engineering programs:

- Aerospace Science and Engineering *Physics 9D is no longer required*
- Biochemical Engineering Engineering Chemical and Materials Science (ENG CMS) 6 has been canceled; the major now requires the renamed course Chemical Engineering (ENG CHM) 60 or Engineering Computer Science (ENG CS) 30 or Engineering (ENGIN) 6.
- o Biological Systems Engineering
- Biomedical Engineering
- Chemical Engineering
 - An option to complete Engineering (ENGIN) 17 or Engineering (ENGIN) 35 or Engineering (ENGIN) 45 is now offered.
 - Engineering Chemical and Materials Science (ENG CMS) 6 has been canceled; the major now requires the renamed course Chemical Engineering (ENG CHM) 60 or Engineering Computer Science (ENG CS) 30 or Engineering (ENGIN) 6.
- Civil Engineering Engineering (ENGIN) 45 is no longer required.
- Computer Engineering
- o Electrical Engineering
- Environmental Engineering: *This new major is open to fall 2018 applicants.* <u>See courses required for</u> <u>admission online</u>.
- Computer Science Engineering

- o Material Science
- Mechanical Engineering *Physics 9D is no longer recommended.*
 - Mechanical Engineering majors are encouraged, but not required, to complete the following courses prior to transfer: Communication 1 or 3, Engineering 45, English 3 or University Writing Program 1.

• <u>College of Letter and Science</u> = 3.2 GPA

The following Selective majors under this college require additional GPA requirements.

Computer Science – minimum <u>3.40</u> group GPA in the following two course groups:

- Mathematics 21A/B/C (251/252)
- Engineering Computer Science (ENG CS) 20, 30, 50, 60 (at Cañada: CIS 262, 118, 242, 252)

If one course from a group is completed at the time the TAG is submitted, that course must be completed with an A- grade or better. ENG CS 40 (CIS 250) is strongly recommended for completion prior to transfer; however, it is not required for transfer admission selection.

- Psychology minimum GPA of 2.9 in the following courses:
 - Psychology 1 (PSCY 100)
 - Statistic 13 (Math 200)
 - One of these two options:
 - Biological Sciences 2A or
 - Biological Sciences 10 (BIOL 110) AND
 - One of the following courses:
 - Psychology 41 (PSYC 205)
 - selective courses: and one of the following courses:
 - o Anthropology 1 (ANTH 110) or
 - Neurobiology, Physiology and Behaviour 10 (BIOL 130 or 260) or
 - Molecular and Cellular Biology 10 (no comparable course at Cañada)

UC TAG Limitations:

TAG does not apply to:

- Students who have baccalaureate or higher level degrees
- Former UC students who left the University when not in good standing
- Former UC Davis students (exclusive of UC Davis summer session)
- Students who are enrolled simultaneously at a CCC and Baccalaureate or other non-CCC institution when TAG is submitted, up to the time of enrollment.

Notes and Changes in the programs for fall 2018:

- Cognitive Science, A.B. and B.S. is now open for TAG
- Film Studies is closed interested students may apply to Cinema and Digital Media

Limitations - TAG does not apply to:

- Students who have baccalaureate or higher level degrees
- Former UC students who were not in good standing
- Former UC Davis students who regularly attended (exclusive of UC Davis summer session)
- Students attending high school in fall 2017 or later, even if simultaneously enrolled at a CCC

 Students with UC-transferable units that are greater than or equal to 80 semester (120 quarter) units after applying UC lower-division unit limitations and exclusions—College of Engineering applicants are exempt from this limitation

Majors and Programs Closed for TAGs at UC Davis:

- Undeclared/Exploratory (College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences)
- The discontinued Natural Sciences
- The suspended Fiber and Polymer Science
- The suspended Textiles and Clothing
- Architecture applicants must apply to Pre-Landscape Architecture
 - Students must also complete and submit a portfolio in February. For more information students must contact the department at (530) 754-8628 or visit humanecology.ucdavis.edu/lda. Admission to UC Davis in pre-landscape architecture does not guarantee admission to the landscape architecture major.

The following is the general TAG requirements for UC Irvine, but you also need to meet the major re-requisite requirements that is different for each School. General Requirements:

- One UC-transferable **math course** with a grade of C or better must be completed by the end of the summer 2017 term
- One UC-transferable **English course** with a grade of C or better must be completed by the end of the summer 2017 term (second UC-transferable English course must be completed by the end of spring 2018)
- <u>All major coursework</u> for the chosen major including course prerequisites and minimum course GPA must be completed by the end of spring 2018 for fall 2018 admission. Please review the major <u>Course requirements</u>.
- Be in good standing for all colleges attended, and satisfy all UC transfer eligibility requirements.
- Complete the last 30 semester or 45 quarter units at a California community college by the end of the spring 2018 term.

Unit requirements:

- Completed 30 semester UC-transferable units by the end of the summer 2017 term for fall 2018 admission at one or more California community colleges, **including** AP/IB/A-level credit;
- Complete 60 UC transferrable semester units by the end of spring 2018

Minimum GPA requirements = 3.4 GPA for all UC transferrable courses by summer 2017 (this is subject to change)

• Earned a minimum GPA of **3.4** in all UC-transferable coursework by the end of the summer 2017 for fall 2018 admission and will maintain GPA of **3.4** in all UC-transferable coursework for all subsequent terms;

Limitations

• Students who have reached or exceed 90 semester units of combined community college and four-year College transferable lower division coursework. (The four-year university includes in or outside of the United States.)

- Be enrolled full-time at a community college.
- Complete one UC transferrable math course with grade of C (2.0) or higher by the end of Fall 2017 term.
- Complete two UC transferrable English courses: one by the end of Fall 2017 and one the of Spring 2018 each with a grade of C or higher.
- No unrepeated grade(s) of "D" or "F" in UC-transferable coursework.
- No more than two withdraws in major preparation courses
- By the spring 2018 applicants can have no more than one major preparation course where grades of No Pass, D or F were received even if repeated with passing grades.
- International students must also meet the English proficiency requirements for UC Merced

Unit requirements:

- Completed 30 semester units at the time of TAG application
- Complete 60 semester units by the end of spring 2018

Minimum GPA requirements:

• School of Engineering = 3.0 GPA for all majors

General requirements:

- Only California Community College (CCC) students are considered for a TAG, including international students (with a visa). California College student are defined as those students who completed more than half of their units at a CCC.
- You must maintain the required GPA for your intended major (see below).

Unit requirements:

- Completed 30 semester units at the time of TAG application **excluding** AP/IB Credit
- Complete 60 semester units by the end of spring 2015 with the required GPA for your specific major before transfer
- You must complete any required major prep for your intended major. See major selection criteria at <u>www.assist.org</u>.
- The First English Composition course must be completed by the end of Fall 2017, and the second year of English by the end of spring 2018 term.
- Non-selecting majors must complete a minimum of one UC-transferable math (UC-M) by Fall 20175.
- For selective majors, (listed below), must complete the required math course for major (check <u>ASSIST.org</u>) by the end of fall 2017.
- The School of Business Administration requires completion of IGETC.

Minimum GPA requirements

- School of Business Administration = **3.5** GPA (This College requires completion of IGETC)
- College of Humanities and Social Sciences = 2.7 GPA
- College of Engineering plus major prep courses = 3.0 GPA
- College of Natural and Agricultural Sciences plus major prep courses = 2.8 GPA

Limitations

Only students transferring in directly from a California Community College (CCC) are considered for a TAG, including international students (with a visa). The University of California defines a CCC transfer student as one who has completed more than half of their units at a California Community Colleges.

General Information:

UC Santa Barbara does not provide an early evaluation or early decision for TAG applicants. Applicants will be notified of their admission decisions between mid-March and the end of April.

The following information outlines the UC Santa Barbara Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) for the College of Letters and Science for the fall 2018 term only.

• PRE-MAJORS:

Some UCSB majors require students to complete remaining major preparation courses with a minimum GPA after transfer in order to advance to full major status. For majors with these pre-major requirements, TAG applies to admission to the pre-major. Meeting TAG requirements does not guarantee that a student will fulfill the pre-major requirements after transfer. Major preparation articulation agreements (found online at www.assist.org) include detailed information about the pre-majors. Students may contact UCSB academic department advisors to discuss their plans to transfer and get more information about the pre-major

Unit and Course Requirements:

- Completed 30 semester units at the time of TAG application (only 16 quarter/10.6 Semester units of AP/IB/A level can be counted toward the first 30 semester units).
- Complete at least 60 semester UC transferrable units by the end of spring 2018 with no more than 18 units in Spring 2018. (cannot use AP/IB credits toward the second half of 60 units)
- 30 units of 60 UC transfer units must be completed at California Community College.
- No more than 90 semester units of combined community college and baccalaureate institution credits, **excluding** AP/IB credits.
- Two English composition courses must be completed by the end of Fall 2017 with grade "C" or Higher
- Math course must be completed by the end of Fall 2017 with grade "C" or Higher
- By the end of Spring 2018, complete four courses selected from among at least two of the following 3 areas with "C" or higher:
 - o Art and Humanities
 - o Behavioral and Social Sciences
 - Biological and Physical Sciences

Minimum GPA requirements - College of Letter and science:

- Overall UC Transferrable courses by the end of Fall 2017 and maintain through Spring 2018= 3.2 GPA AND
- All UC-transferable coursework in the fall 2017 term = a minimum 2.0 GPA AND
- All UC-transferable coursework in the spring 2018 term = a minimum 2.0 GPA
- For majors in Biological Sciences and Economics, complete required major preparation courses with a minimum GPA in required in the major courses, as stated on the major articulation agreement.

Biological Sciences majors (listed below) = a minimum GPA of 2.7

- Complete a one-year sequence of **general chemistry** with laboratory with no individual grade lower than "C."
- Complete a sequence (two to three terms) of major-applicable **general biology** with laboratory with no individual grade lower than "C."

Note: For students to graduate within two years of transferring, it is strongly recommend the completion of one year of organic chemistry with laboratory, one year of general physics with laboratory and one year of calculus or calculus with statistics. Any of these courses completed with a grade lower than "C" might not satisfy course prerequisites at UCSB.

Economics = a minimum GPA of 2.75 in the following courses with no individual course lower than "C":

 - Economics B.A.
 - Economics and Accounting B.A.

NOTE: Advanced Placement exams in macroeconomics and microeconomics may NOT be used to satisfy major preparation requirements.

Important Notes/Conditions:

- TAG applies to the College of Letters and Science (L&S) that do not have a Pre-major.
- A maximum of 70 UC-transferable semester units of lower division coursework from any college or university will transfer to UC. All community college courses are lower division. Subject credit is awarded for courses taken beyond 70 semester units.
- Any lower division coursework completed at any UC campus, including UC Extension, will not apply to the 70 semester unit limitation. All transferable units will apply toward the 90 semester unit limit for senior standing.
- All UC-transferable upper division coursework completed at a four year university (other than UC) will apply toward the 90 semester unit limit for senior standing.
- Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) and A Level exam units do not apply to the 90 semester unit (135 quarter unit) limit for senior standing
- College of Letters & Science expects students to earn their degree without exceeding 200 quarter units

Limitations:

• TAG does not apply to students with senior class standing (students with 90 or more UC-transferable semester units) from accredited four-year universities, or accredited four-year universities and community colleges combined. (The four-year university includes in or outside of the United States.)

Requirements:

- Student must be enrolled at a California community college (student may have attended colleges or universities outside of the California community college system, including institutions outside of the U.S.)
- Completed a minimum of 30 semester units at the time of TAG application with a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- Complete a minimum of 60 semester units by the end of spring 2018
- Complete a minimum of 30 UC-transferable semester (45 quarter units) of coursework from one or more California community colleges
- Student must demonstrate adequate preparation in the subject areas of English composition and mathematics (first English course and Math course must be completed no later than the fall 2017)
- Students must be in good academic standing (not on academic probation or dismissal status)
- Non-native speakers of English must demonstrate proficiency in English. All applicants who attend a school in a country where English is not the native language or whose language of instruction in high school (secondary school) was not English to adequately demonstrate English competency as a part of the application process. In most cases, if less than three years of your secondary schooling was with English as the language of instruction, you must meet UCSC's English proficiency requirement. To demonstrate English proficiency:
 - Students may take <u>one of the exams</u> listed on the UCSC International Students undergraduate admission web page.
 - Transfer students may fulfill the English Proficiency requirement by completing two UC-transferable English composition courses (not ESL) in the U.S. with grades of B (3.00) or better.

Minimum GPA requirements = 3.0 for all majors

Please see the major Prep course requirements. Some major may require additional/different GPA requirements for major prep courses.

Limitations:

The following students are NOT eligible for UCSC TAG:

- TAG does not apply to students with senior class standing (students with 90 or more UC-transferable semester units) from accredited four-year universities, or accredited four-year universities and community colleges combined. (The four-year university includes in or outside of the United States.)
- Former UC students who are not in good standing at the UC campus they attended (less than a 2.0 GPA at UC)

- Former UCSC students, who must apply for readmission to the campus
- Students who have earned a bachelor's degree or higher

Many students who are not eligible for TAG are still exceptionally well-qualified and are strongly encouraged to apply for admission through the regular application process during the filing period. For fall 2018 admission, the UC Application filing period is November 1–30, 2017.
