Overview of SMCCCD Study Abroad

Program Types:

- 1) semester programs (Barcelona, Florence, London)
- 2) short-term faculty-led programs (2024 Spain, Thailand, Vietnam, Ghana, the Philippines)
- 3) global internships (9 sites in 9 countries in 2024)
- 4) transfer abroad (Rennes School of Business in France)
- 5) community travel programs (Art in France, Japanese Culture, Argentina)
- Semester programs: Fall 2022 London (19), Spring 2023 Florence (26), Fall 2023 Barcelona (20), Spring 2024 Florence (27), Fall 2024 London
- **Community Travel Program**: 17 participants attended the Art Immersion in France Program, which generated about \$10,000 in Study Abroad Scholarships to the SMCCC Foundation.
- **Scholarship advising**: Gilman International Scholarship, Fund for Education Abroad, SMCCCD Study Abroad Scholarship, SMCCCD Foundation Scholarship, AIFS scholarship, etc.
- Skyline College was recognized as the #1 Top Producing Gilman Scholarship Community College in the nation by the U.S. Department of State in 2022.

What is a Short-Term Faculty-Led Study Abroad Program?

- It is a credit bearing course where the faculty member and the registered students travel abroad for part or for the entire course, for one or more units.
- Abroad is any country (at Level 1 or 2 Travel Advisory) outside of the United States.
- The program length can be 10 days, 2 weeks, 3 weeks, 4 weeks, or 6 weeks (half semester).
- Full-time or part-time SMCCCD faculty may apply and lead short-term study abroad programs, including Community Travel Program.



- Courses taught in fall/spring semesters should be part of faculty's course load and are not subject to extra service pay.
- Courses taught in summer session need to meet the minimum enrollment of 10 students to receive full summer salary.

Questions about Your Program Details in the Proposal

- 1. Your Expectations of the program
- 2. Familiarity with the study abroad site
- 3. Learning outcomes of the course
- 4. Preliminary itinerary
- 5. Health and safety consideration
- 6.On-site logistics
- 7. Preliminary budget
- 8. Recruitment experience and strategies
- 9. Student behavior and expectations
- 10. Additional time for the program



Responsibilities of Faculty Leaders

Recruitment

 Actively recruit applicants (presentations in classes, info sessions, social media, etc.)

Student Applications

- Review applications
- Hold interviews with applicants

Pre-Departure

- Offer pre-departure orientation sessions with the third-party service provider
- Finalize program logistics
- Prepare an emergency contingency plan

While Abroad

- Confirm safe arrival
- Oversee academic aspects of the program
- Oversee program logistics
- Act as primary resource for student inquiries and problems
- Act as the initial responder to logistical, medical, behavioral, and other crises

Upon Return

- Submit grades
- Gather receipts and documentation
- Conduct program evaluation
