Faculty from all three campuses make up the AOC (Anti-oppression Committee) stemming from AFT. Among relevant issues, we are working on an educational campaign around sexual misconduct, assault and harassment. We have had two meetings with Chancellor Moreno, Mwanaisha Sims, Julie Johnson, and Oyame KenZoe Brian Selassie, given input on college and district websites and procedures, and are planning a joint flex day presentation with Mwanaisha Sims and AOC faculty to share out the updates to sexual misconduct, harassment, and assault policies (title ix and sb493). We want to engage with you all, our faculty leadership and seek your advocacy around eradicating the threat of sexual misconduct, harassment, and assault on our campuses, especially for women, nonbinary, LGBTQ+ individuals, and especially for our students, our most vulnerable population. This is why faculty from all three colleges are going to our senates to request senate's support to carry out the request to include Sexual misconduct, harassment, and assault (Title IX/SB493) information on all course syllabi.

This is relevant to California Education Code Section 234:

The Safe Place to Learn Act- It is the policy of the State of California to ensure that all local educational agencies continue to work to reduce discrimination, harassment, violence, intimidation, and bullying. It is further the policy of the state to improve pupil safety at schools and the connections between pupils and supportive adults, schools, and communities.

The HSS division office is required for college accreditation purposes to have on file a syllabus for every course in the division each term. Additionally, the division office may answer student questions with a quick reference to your syllabus. To review course SLOs and other important information, visit <u>http://www.curricunet.com/SMCCCD/search/course/</u>. Search "Active" courses by "Course Number" in your discipline to review the official Course Outline of Record.

## All course syllabi should clearly identify:

- Faculty name and office number (if assigned an office)
- · Faculty contact information—office number and work email
- · Office hours—in-person and virtual, if teaching online
- · Course name, number and section, description, and classroom location/online information
- · Final examination day and time (recommended)
- · Student Learning Outcomes
- · Required and Recommended Texts
- · Course Requirements
  - o Assignments
  - o Detailed Grading Policy
  - o Course Policies
  - o Attendance Policy (Note: It is a violation of Title V to use "attendance" as a criterion for final grades; however, "participation" can be used as a criterion as long as it is clearly stated in the syllabus.)
