- 11:30 AM Welcome and Introductions
 - Staff shared updates including spring break experiences, student support efforts,

upcoming events, and academic preparation for the end of semester.

- Highlights included Earth Fest, STEM Center activities, and Learning Center workshops.
- Julian shared recruitment plans for tutors with over 40 expected vacancies.

- Retention specialists emphasized efforts to build community and student engagement.

- Multiple departments emphasized student-facing support, preparation for summer/fall, and coordination with counseling.

- Revamped Faculty Teaching & Learning website now serves as a one-stop shop for DE, Canvas, RSI, and instructional technology resources.

- Conversations with Colleagues sessions are being shaped to address student-centered needs and interdisciplinary collaboration.

- Emphasis on adding resources helpful for tutoring, technical writing, mental health, and AI awareness.

- Suggestions from team members included highlighting retention best practices, public library access, and student agreements to foster commitment.

- 12:00 PM Streaming Films Discussion (Carlos Luna & Adriana Lugo)
 - A new request process for streaming films was shared.

- Emphasis on planning ahead (9–13 week lead time), searching existing databases (Kanopy, Swank, Films on Demand), and submitting requests through the form.

- Financial transparency was discussed: 1-year licenses start around \$120, and

perpetual licenses may cost over \$600.

- Encouragement to utilize public libraries and coordinate requests well in advance to support programming.
