- The DRC Alt Media staff will help approved smartpen students get set up




Smartpen Hardware

- ► Echo Desktop, the software that accompanies the Smartpen, allows users to
 - Transfer notes and lectures from your pen to your computer
 - Review and organize notes and lectures
 - Free storage space on your pen by using the 'Archive Notebook' feature
 - Create copies of your notes that can be saved, emailed, and accessed from any device that supports Adobe and is connected to the internet

The Livescribe Notebook

- ► The <u>Livescribe Notebook</u> is specialized for use with the Smartpen
- The pen and notebook work together to create electronically scanned copies of written notes
- The icons in the Livescribe notebook allow pen configuration, audio recording, and audio playback, with just a tap of the pen
