As of right now, we have posted the land acknowledgement we stated at the beginning of your meeting on the EAPC website since it is the one that Student Life created in collaboration with Dr. Cordero of The Association of the Ramaytush Ohlone.

to pay respects to past elders and honor the present community. Long before Cañada College existed, this area was home to the Ramaytush Ohlone

peoples who still have a presence in the bay today. Let us not forget the colonization of this land. Let us honor the people who have stewarded this land

for generations, and let us honor the truth."

For consistency and the importance of "nothing about us without us" EAPC will vote on whether to "officially adopt" this land acknowledgement as the official land acknowledgement for our college.
