New Inclusion Support Certificate!

Working with children with special needs or interested in doing so in the future? Want more knowledge and skills, or to brush up on your current skill-set? Then check out the Inclusion Support (IS) Certificate that will officially be available beginning Fall 2019! You can earn the IS Certificate after completing just 10 units. Required courses include:

- ECE 260 (3 units) – Children with Special Needs**
- ECE 263 (3 units) – Support Strategies for Children with Special Needs**
- EDUC 265 (3 units) – Positive Behavior Support in Inclusive Settings**
- EDUC 300 (1 unit) – Applied Inclusive Practices *NEW COURSE!***

Of course, you can take any of these courses separately, but if working with unique children is your passion, then go for the entire certificate!

EDUC 300, the newest course, will be offered for the first time in Fall 2019. It's a one-unit course that allows students to create their own "project" concerning children with special needs with whom they work, their own program environment and curriculum, or perhaps with their own child. EDUC 300 content will focus on Universal Design for Learning (UDL) and inclusive practices, but it'll be entirely each student's choice how to use and apply his/her knowledge and skills in real-life settings working with diverse children.

What is FKCE? Foster & Kinship Care Education Program

Safety, permanency, and well-being for all children and families in San Mateo County! These are the goals of our County's Child Welfare program and the mission for Cañada College's Foster and Kinship Care Program (FKCE) under our Education and Human Development Department is to collaborate with the Department of Human Services and provide high quality education and training opportunities for the Resource Families (formerly called Foster Families). These families include foster and relative caregivers of children and youth in out-of-home care in San Mateo County. These FKCE trainings assists the families in meeting the educational, behavioral and developmental needs of children and youth.

In 2016 there were 90 approved Resource Family homes in the County and in 2018-19 we are building on at least 154 approved Resource Family homes. A third of these are homes of relatives. Presently there are 228 children and youth in foster care in our County.

Every month throughout the year, the FKCE provides trainings on three Saturdays for the approval process for fostering, legal guardianship, and/or adoption as well as post-approval required trainings to satisfy the yearly training hours for the Resource Families. This year we included an additional training with Common Sense Media concerning digital health with children and youth. We are currently working on trainings on trauma/explosive behaviors and LGBTQ challenges in our communities.

Did you know that Cañada College has numerous support services for foster youth who are enrolled in college? This includes transportation vouchers, meal tickets, and class registration priorities. The College also coordinates services with the Independent Learning Program for Foster Youth at College of San Mateo.
