Cañada College utilizes the CCCApply Interest Survey to conduct athletic interest. The top four sports Cañada College students are interested in are as follows:

Women's Sports

- 1. Badminton (5 students) Inaugural Season debuts Spring of 2025
- 2. Basketball (4 students) General student course offering and Varsity approved in curriculum.
- 3. Volleyball (21 students) General student course offering and Varsity approved in curriculum.
- 4. Swimming and Diving (14 students) Cañada pool does not meet requirements for diving.

2021-2022 was the first full academic year the Athletics Department was able to utilize and offer sports in the new Building 1 Kinesiology and Wellness facility. The 85,000 square foot building is the home for the athletics teams, a three-storied building with dedicated locker room space, varsity weight room, smart classroom, gymnasium, athletic treatment center, coach office space, and two swimming pools for both instruction and intercollegiate athletics.

2022-2024

Facilities were updated in May of 2024 to be able to add Intercollegiate Women's Badminton. The inaugural competition seasons of these Women's Intercollegiate Sport's are scheduled to commence in the spring of 2025. Currently, our new facility is not able to accommodate Women's Volleyball or Women's Basketball without performing some structural changes. After meeting with the Deans/AD's in the SMCCD, we agreed that until the participation numbers increase for Women's Basketball in the District, Cañada College will delay starting a Women's Basketball Team to their Athletic Program .
