## Scholarships from the SMCCC Foundation

Scholarships are grants or payments made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement. Having a scholarship helps students with the high cost of education in the U.S. However, being awarded a scholarship is also a recognition of your high academic achievement and engagement in the campus community that you can put in your transfer applications. The San Mateo Community College (SMCCC) Foundation offers many scholarships to students. However, keep in mind that international students are only eligible for scholarships from private donors and foundations and not federally funded scholarship by the U.S. government.

Luckily, the SMCCC Foundation has one application for several scholarship opportunities. The application will request information to verify that you meet the qualifications for different scholarships including your grade point average (GPA), the SAT or TOEFL scores, your major, whether you are the first in your family to attend college and other information.

The scholarship application also requires you to write an essay where it is usually about our educational and professional goals and any

challenges we have overcome to achieve those goals.

Scholarships also ask for letters of recommendation, usually from your professors or employers. So it's important to build good relationships with faculty and staff on campus. The deadline to apply for the SMCCC Foundation scholarships is March 2 and the Financial Aid Office offers workshops in Bldg 9-123 to help you understand the scholarship application process: <http://canadacollege.edu/financialaid/scholarship.php>
