

U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Occupational Outlook:

- Paralegal employment is projected to increase by 14% from 2021 to 2031
- The 14% growth rate is higher than the average for all occupations
- ➤ 45,800 paralegal job openings are projected each year from 2021 to 2031

Local Community & Labor Needs

SAN MATEO COUNTY NEEDS PARALEGALS!

- Survey shows high demand for paralegals trained in technology (legal software, trial technology, and e-discovery.)
- San Mateo Bar Association and the San Mateo Superior Court want the Paralegal Program to expand
- Courts order parties to pay paralegal fees in probate, trust, personal injury, and contract cases

Past IPC Feedback & Response

Labor needs for non-ABA paralegal programs?

- ✓ No impact on hiring compared to ABA paralegal programs
- ✓ ABA cannot "certify" or "accredit" a paralegal program
- \checkmark ABA approval only relates to how the certificate is administered
- ✓ California law, not ABA, determines who can be called a Paralegal



Enrollment Trends: Enrollment

2017-2018

2018-2019

- 2017-2018: Only 48 students enrolled in the Paralegal Program
- 2020-2021: Enrollment increased more than five times the level of 2017
- 2021-2022: Slight enrollment drop
- 2022-2023: Enrollment is still more than four times as high than in 2017-2018.







Enrollment Trends: Section Count

- Paralegal Program is operating more efficiently!
- Enrollment increased four to five times since 2017-2018
- Staffing only increased three times
- Section Count has increased:
 - 2017-2018 6
 - 2021-2022 15
 - 2022-2023 14





Enrollment Trends: FTEF and Load


The Paralegal Program has been operating more efficiently because enrollment increased four to five times, but staffing only increased three times.

FTEF Increased

- 2017-2018: FTEF = 1
- 2021-2022: FTEF = 3

Load Increased

- 2017-2018: 39
- 2021-2022: 219



Equity and Equity Gaps

- Expanded community-based partnerships
- Created flexible learning environments to enable students to complete their Certificate or degree
- Supported students through mentoring with faculty and legal professionals
- Removed enrollment barriers by removing unnecessary prerequisites
