## Proactive Right-Sizing Approach on Course Schedule


#### Proactive adjustments for right-sizing:

- Regular review of course offerings and enrollment patterns
- Data-informed decision making
- Strategic scheduling to maximize efficiency
- Balancing high and low-enrolled courses

#### Department-level considerations:

- Collaborative planning process
- Focus on program pathways and completion
- Maintaining educational quality while improving efficiency

# Maintain, Optimize, Stabilize





## Data-Driven and Collaborative Process

#### Metrics for Success:

- Enrollment trends, Fill-Rate, Program Completion in two-year, Load, and FTEF allocation
- **Deans and VPI Leadership:** Actively monitor course schedules to ensure:
  - Core and selective courses are offered predictably and frequently.
  - Low-enrolled electives do not divert resources from critical pathways.
  - Set FTEF allocation goal annually that ensures program completion.
- Communication with lead faculty

#### No Surprises:

- Incremental changes are tied to data, along with early communication.
- Invite feedback to refine course planning processes.

**Course Schedule Planning** 

#### Safeguarding Quality:

- Protect high-demand programs and core course availability.
- Minimize student delays from inconsistent scheduling

**Course Availabilities** 

#### Open Dialogue:

Communicate early about lowenrolled classes (AP 6.04.1), and use the general criteria set in BP 6.04 to decide when to offer courses that are below our standard minimum enrollment requirements.




## We are in maintenance mode, not growth or reduction
