

cañada college PROMISE SCHOLARS PROGRAM


The Promise Scholars Program provides financial, academic and personalized student services including dedicated counseling and transportation assistance for first-time college students who enroll at Cañada College full-time to earn a certificate or degree. The program is based on the ASAP model developed by the City University of New York which has doubled graduation rates.

The Promise Scholars Program at Cañada College has seen clear success with its first cohort of 327. Beginning in Fall 2018, the Promise Scholars Program began the process to replicate the ASAP model, implementing key components of the CUNY program and expanding to serve 500 students in the Fall 2018 and Fall 2019 cohort.

PROMISE SCHOLAR METRICS


FIRST GENERATION STATUS

(Fall 2019 Cohort)



The Promise Scholars Program served 327 students who demonstrated an 78.1% fall '18 - fall '19 persistence rate - significantly higher than the 69.5% persistence rate of the full-time comparison group.**


