## Capital Project Update

The **Building 1** (Kinesiology and Wellness) project, due to [permitting delays](#), has moved underground...literally. Utility work has begun on Building 1 in order to prepare the site for water, gas and light. This underground work will go on through the start of Spring 2019 semester. Also, as this work happens, street parking on side of the site (going downhill on Farm Hill) will be going away. This is for the safety of all on campus. Lastly, the project design still reflects the program requirements and there have been no changes to any of the original floor or usage plans. Continue to watch your email for any construction notices.

**Building 23** (Science and Technology) is getting walls! The “mockup” of what the skin (outside) of the building will look like is still in Parking Lot 7, near the McCarthy Trailers. Go check it out!!

The repair of **Building 9** is on target. The phase three work will begin after the Thanksgiving break. Currently, the windows have been removed and replacement testing is being performed. This portion or work of work is to continue through the start of the Spring 2019 semester.
