#### District Anti-Racism Council Update at the Board Study Session

In August 2020, the Chancellor established the District Anti-Racism Council with the goal to create a culture of equity with a lens of anti-racism, radically reimagine how the District commits to anti-racism and how the District can transform the educational experiences of all students, especially hyper-marginalized students. The District Anti-Racism Council has identified three priority areas: (1) Policy and Procedure; (2) Curriculum and Instruction, and (3) Equal Employment Opportunity. At the study session on Wednesday, September 22, the Board received an update from the District Anti-Racism Council and engaged in a conversation about how the Board can partner with the Council to further this important work.
