### COVID – 19 Vaccination Requirement Suspended

On October 26, 2022, the San Mateo County Community College District Board of Trustees suspended the COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement (<u>Board Policy</u> <u>2.90</u>), effective immediately. The District no longer requires COVID-19 vaccination documentation or medical/religious exemptions for any individual. **Employees, students, and the broader community may now access district facilities and in-person services regardless of vaccination status.** Please remove any COVID vaccination attestation or requirement messaging from email signatures, websites, and any other communication channels.

SMCCCD continues to recommend staying up to date with <u>COVID-19 vaccines</u>, <u>including boosters</u> regardless of risk factors. To schedule an appointment, visit <u>myturn.ca.gov</u>. For additional information, visit the <u>Return to Campus</u> site.
