Last Friday, Governor Newsom signed SB 893, the bill which allows San Mateo County residents to attend community college for free! The San Mateo County Community College District's Free College initiative will allow students, who demonstrate financial need, to be exempt from paying enrollment and other fees associated with college enrollment. You can read more about it <u>here.</u> As Chancellor Claire shared in a districtwide employee message, this bill is monumental for SMCCCD as it will allow our district to use local funds to further our commitment to students of underrepresented and marginalized communities to access free college. Cañada Awarded \$2.6 Million Grant

I'm proud to share that Cañada College was recently awarded a grant from the Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions (DHSI) Program, where Cañada will receive \$2,669,824 over five years! The <u>Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions (DHSI)</u> Program provides grants to assist HSIs to expand educational opportunities for and improve the attainment of Hispanic students. SparkPoint Updates

In partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank, Cañada College will be launching a FREE Grocery Distribution on campus in Lot 6 on Tuesday, October 11, 2022.

This event will be open to students and the community and will provide clients with the opportunity to select the food they want. This weekly distribution will serve 200-250 families to start. Additional information can be found on the attached flyer. The SparkPoint team is looking for community volunteers to join the event; please visit this link to sign up as a community volunteer. In addition, the Food Pantry has been serving a record number of clients. Currently, the Pantry is serving more than 180 families per week (unduplicated) and is serving around 300 families a week (duplicated) monthly. Our Pantry serves students, their families, staff and faculty (basically everyone) by providing healthy and nutritious food at a time of rising food and living costs (This past year, the Consumer Price Index has increased by 9.1 % - the highest increase since 1981). Thank you to the SparkPoint team for identifying new ways to serve our community and support with basic daily needs, such as food.



Vaccination Clinic Appointments Are Full but Walk-ins Are Welcome!

The October 12 Vaccination Clinic appointments are now full. The clinic will accept walk-ins and provide boosters until their supply runs out. The District will host another vaccination clinic by mid-November.

The <u>CDC</u> recommends everyone stay up to date with COVID-19 boosters:

- 18 years and older are recommended to receive one updated Pfizer or Moderna (bivalent) booster. This includes people who have received all primary series doses and people who have previously received one or more original (monovalent) boosters.
- 2. 12 years to 17 years can only receive the updated Pfizer bivalent booster.
- 3. 5 years to 11 years are currently recommended to get the original (monovalent) booster.
- 4. 6 months through 4 years should get all COVID-19 primary series doses.

Getting a COVID-19 vaccine after you recover from COVID-19 infection provides added protection against COVID-19.
