IDEAL Leadership Program

The month of February brings the start of the long-awaited IDEAL Program to the San Mateo County Community College District. The IDEAL (Initiative in Diversity, Equity, Antiracism and Leadership) Program is an equity-advancing professional development program aimed at preparing participants to engage in equity and social justice work. A team of executive leaders from our District office, cabinet members from each college and the Chancellor's cabinet members will comprise the first cohort of IDEAL. The IDEAL cohort will meet two times per week, for four weeks, totaling eight sessions. The IDEAL Core Team comprising of Diva Ward, Dr. Jeremiah Sims and Dr. Oyame KenZoe Selassie-Okpe, worked collaboratively with the IDEAL Curriculum Developers, Jeramy Wallace, Marisol Quevedo and Mariella Thaning, to prepare for the opportunity to work with our IDEAL cohort. We hope this program becomes an integral part of our employee training and advances the development of equitable leadership in our district as an institutionally transformative experience.
