and the Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory System. He was the point-of-contact person for the college catalog, and lead person for the online catalog transition. He also served as the back up to the Sr. Academic Support Specialist where he was responsible for scheduling classes for the college. Moreover, he developed a plan, tracking the college SLOs and assessments to align with the ACCJC standards.

Additionally, he worked with the Department of Research and Planning on program reviews and annual program updates. Most recently, he served as the Project Manager for MESA Connect where he was the point person in the execution of all of the required grant activities. COVID – 19 Vaccination Requirement Suspended

On October 26, 2022, the San Mateo County Community College District Board of Trustees suspended the COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement (Board Policy 2.90), effective immediately. The District no longer requires COVID-19 vaccination documentation or medical/religious exemptions for any individual. Employees, students, and the broader community may now access district facilities and in-person services regardless of vaccination status. Please remove any COVID vaccination attestation or requirement messaging from email signatures, websites, and any other communication channels.
