Dear Cañada Colleagues,

Both Colt Soccer Teams Headed to Second Tound of the CCCAA Playoffs!

All-American Tomislav Jozinovic scored on a penalty kick with five minutes left in overtime to propel the No. 21-seeded Colts (10-9-1) to a 2-1 overtime victory at 12-seeded College of the Sequoias (10-7-4). The Colts will now travel for a game at No. 5-seeded Merced on Saturday. The Colts played from behind after College of the Sequoias went up 1-0 in the 53rd minute. Morgan Johnson scored the equalizer with a pass from Diego Arellano in the 70th minute to tie it at 1-1. After 90 minutes, both teams played an extra 30 minutes. Nico Flores then was fouled in the penalty box, setting up Jozinovic for the winning score. The Colts then played defense until the horn sounded after 120 minutes of play for the upset victory.



Courtney Simons had a goal and an assist as No. 11-seeded Cañada College women's soccer (15-4-0) defeated No. 22-seeded Modesto (6-14-1) 3-0 to move on and play at No. 6-seeded Lake Tahoe on Saturday. Simons opened up the scoring in the 39th minute, taking a pass from Yara Gomez-Zavala and scoring from the middle of the box to make it 1-0 just prior to halftime. Then in the 59th minute, Simons weaved through traffic and passed to her right to Giselle Guiterrez, who scored and made it 2-0. Emmiko Kimura finished off the scoring in the 84th minute, rattling it off the top of bar to make it 3-0. Go Colts!



PBC Adopts Student Equity & Achievement Program (SEAP) Plan for 2022-25 On November 16, 2022, the Planning and Budgeting Council (PBC) adopted a three-year <u>Student Equity and Achievement Program (SEAP) Plan for 2022-25</u> as required by the State Chancellor's Office. The Tri-Chairs of the Academic Committee for Equity and Success (ACES), Professor Alison Field, Dr. Mary Ho and Dr. Manuel Alejandro Pérez, led a writing team who developed this draft over the last 6 months and solicited feedback at Flex Day in October and at various Department and Division meetings as well as at IPC and SSPC this fall. The Board of Trustees will consider this Plan at their November 30 meeting. The College is required to submit this Plan to the State on November 30 as well.
