CAÑADA COLLEGE HOSTS ANNUAL LEADERSHIP RETREAT



On August 10, more than 50 students, faculty, and classified staff leaders and administrators joined together for Cañada College's 6th annual Leadership Retreat. Each year, the Retreat serves as a launching point for the College's implementation of its five-year Educational Master Plan (EMP).

Student voice is a critical aspect of the Retreat and the day began with student leaders sharing the priorities identified by the Associated Students of Cañada College. This year, ASCC President Yuliana Leon Subias shared that student leaders would like to focus on student access to food, transportation, WiFi and participatory governance. President Lopez led a discussion about how those priorities would be addressed during the coming academic year.

Following President Lopez' review of the progress made on last year's EMP priority projects, Vice Presidents Manuel Alejandro Pérez and Chialin Hsieh led a walking tour of campus to visit newly refurbished or updated facilities for many of the programs and services critical to many of the initiatives identified in the College's five-year strategic plan: the new College Cultural Center and mural, the Colts U Transfer Center, the Faculty Teaching & Learning Center and Lounge, and the Career Center. Following the briefing on the status and aspirations of the programs visited during the walking tour, Retreat participants focused on four new EMP priorities for 2023-24:

- Expanding programs and opportunities to new community members in North Fair Oaks, Belle Haven, and East Palo Alto, especially BIPOC communities;
- Reimaging how we support students' accessing career opportunities;
- Strengthening transfer support services to increase transfers; and
- Creating and sustaining an inclusive, antiracist, and equityminded campus culture



Retreat participants focused on each of these priorities during four facilitated sessions and related small-group discussions. This allowed campus leaders to develop a shared understanding of the challenges and opportunities of each of these priorities as they organize their work on these important topics during the coming academic year.

The Academic Senate and Classified Senate Presidents will join President Lopez on College Opening Day in presenting the results from the Retreat and the proposed priorities and work plans for each to the rest of the campus community. These then form the basis of the College's Annual Strategic Plan which will be discussed again and voted on by the Planning & Budgeting Council during its first meeting in September.
