This process included three multi-hour workshops with our art partner Precita Eyes and lead muralist Francisco Franco. The collage of images has been created to represent our core values. Our core values in this mural project are the following: social justice, liberation, cultural empathy, and academic success.



Cañada College Classified Employee of the Year – Nominations Due March 6

Each year, the Board of Governors along with the State Chancellor's Office seeks nominations from each community college district for their Classified Employee of the Year Award. In our district, the three colleges and the District Office each nominate one classified employee. The Board of Trustees reviews the resulting four nominations received and makes the final selection of the nominee to be forwarded to the State. Considerations for the award include a commitment to high standards of job performance and professionalism, demonstrated leadership, collaboration, knowledge, and other criteria.

I encourage and invite all members of the Cañada Community (students, faculty members, and classified staff) to nominate a classified employee for our college's award. If you wish to nominate someone, please review the award criteria and complete the attached nomination form. Please note that there are <u>five</u> questions requiring a narrative reply. I realize that you may not have all the information about the employee you wish to nominate, but please try to complete the form as best as you can. Because of the very short time we have to provide our nominee to the Board of Trustees, all nominations must be <u>received by Monday, March 6 at 4:30 p.m.</u> Please submit your completed nomination form to the Office of the President at <u>CANPresident@smccd.edu</u>. The College Cabinet will then review the nominations and make a final selection by March 8 to ensure that we meet the deadline for submitting our nominee to the District.

President's Student Leadership Award – Nominations Due March 24

At this year's Commencement Ceremony, one student will be recognized for outstanding scholarship and leadership. We welcome your nomination of the student who you believe reflects the spirit of this award, embodies its positive attributes, and meets its criteria:

- demonstrates outstanding academic achievement
- reflects a committed pursuit of educational goals
- demonstrates leadership qualities that represent the values and mission of the College
- achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.8 or higher
- is a graduating student in Summer 2022, Fall 2022, or Spring 2023.
