Dr. Chialin Hsieh – Vice President of Instruction

I am pleased to share that, pending board approval on April 26, Dr. Chialin Hsieh will serve Cañada College as our Vice President of Instruction. She will begin her permanent position on May 1, 2023.

Dr. Hsieh is an accomplished leader with more than 20 years of experience in various administrative roles across different educational systems. She has served as a director, dean, senior dean, and interim vice president at a research university in Michigan, liberal arts university, K-12 School District Systems in Missouri, and community colleges in California. In these roles, she has been responsible for budget development and management, organizational development, curriculum development, personnel selection and evaluation, federal regulations, Title 5/Ed Code, and accreditation standards.

Dr. Hsieh is committed to promoting diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging in all aspects of her work and understands the critical role an inclusive and welcoming environment plays in student success and the overall health of an educational institution. She is a goal-oriented, solution-focused, and people-oriented leader who has made significant contributions to academic programs, strategic planning, assessments, and ensuring adherence to students' needs, college mission, and accreditation standards.

Dr. Hsieh holds a Doctorate in Educational Leadership with a specialization in research, evaluation, and assessment, a Master's degree in Educational Leadership, and a Master's in Music Therapy. She also has a Bachelor's degree in Music Therapy and a Bachelor's in Music from Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, Michigan, and Chinese Culture University, Taipei, Taiwan, respectively. She was a registered music therapist.



Outside of her work at Cañada College, Dr. Hsieh is an active member of the local community, serving as the Board President of the South San Francisco Unified School District, as well as a board member of the Research and Planning Group (RP Group). Dr. Hsieh's visionary leadership and passion for education, innovation, and collaboration make her an invaluable asset to Cañada College.



- Top Distinguished Chapter out of all the Chapters in the Nevada/California Region




Equity and Antiracism Planning Council (EAPC) Pilot Update
