#### **Puente Mural Tour**

On March 24, our Puente students from Cañada College enjoyed a 90-minute walking mural tour in the Mission District of San Francisco. ## Cañada College Hosted 11th Annual OYE Latinx Youth Conference

On March 25, Cañada College hosted the 11th Annual OYE Latinx Youth Conference: Honoring Our Roots & Launching Into the Future! More than 550 community members joined in person, with additional live-streaming viewers and virtual participants, for a day to explore and express Latinx culture and identity and engage in finding tools to overcome challenges, pathways to the future and strategies to strengthen our communities. The morning keynote speaker, A'ric Jackson, spoke about unapologetically being our true selves and not letting others limit our potential. The afternoon keynote speaker, Flor Martinez Zaragoza, discussed leadership and making your voice heard to support our greater community. It was such an inspiring time, hearing how our community can connect and learn in this ever-growing online world.

This year, the OYE Conference offered 26 workshops for young people (ages 12-22) and families to explore their community strength through the workshops they attended. The information from the workshops helped our community learn about their rights, explore traditional dance, create art as a healing practice and find educational opportunities, including attending Cañada College. Participants also had the opportunity to connect with 30 resource partners and enjoy various performances from local musicians and dancers. # **Cañada College Begins Mural Community Paint Days**

We paused our painting plans as we encountered stormy weather the last couple weeks. The rain clouds have vanished for now and Cañada College's historic first mural is ready to be painted by the campus and greater community. The Cañada College mural is a visual story, a story of our college, grounded in social justice and informed by the campus community. More than 35 students, faculty, staff and administrators participated in the campus-wide mural design process. This process included three multi-hour workshops with art partner, Precita Eyes, and lead by muralist Francisco Franco. The collage of images has been created to represent Cañada's core values: social justice, liberation, cultural empathy and academic success. The intent of this student-led project was to create a welcoming environment rooted in social justice.

Earlier this year, the Mural Project Committee received a draft of the college mural. The draft design was reviewed by participants of the design workshops that were hosted earlier this semester, in addition to a core group of campus leaders with expertise in art. Cañada's collaborative partner, Precita Eyes Muralists, incorporated the suggestions that emerged from the preliminary review related to Cañada's college core values. The campus was invited to provide feedback on a second draft of the mural design in March and painting has now begun!







# **Cañada Student Secures International Scholarship**

Cañadian Anthony Leon Chumptazi has been selected as a Fall 2022 Oberndorf Lifeline to Completion Scholar and will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. This scholarship is designed to assist Phi Theta Kappa members in overcoming unanticipated financial barriers preventing the completion of the college credential, an associate degree or certificate while enrolled in college.
