Continued Growth for Zero and Low Textbook Cost

Cañada's Textbook Affordability Subcommittee recently shared the zero-textbook cost (ZTC) and low-textbook cost (LTC) course data for the Spring 2023 semester and they are quite impressive:

- ZTC: 60 courses (142.86% from Spring 2022), 90 sections (152.54% from Spring 2022)
- LTC: 12 courses (same as Spring 2022), 17 sections (68% from Spring 2022)
- 51 unique faculty (150% from Spring 2022)
- 2,917 (duplicated) students in these sections (249.32% from Spring 2022)
- \$266,600 estimated savings in these sections (263.83% from Spring 2022)

Additionally, the College has made some significant strides in offering zero-cost and low-cost course sections. Since Spring 2021, a total of 9,878 students (duplicated) have enrolled in a ZTC or LTC course, with the estimated savings of \$928,800 over those five semesters and two summer periods. This coming summer, we will top 10,000 students served and \$1,000,000 estimated savings!

Thank you for supporting faculty in this work! The ZTC/LTC team is routinely including sections that are part of Umoja and College for Working Adults, working with more Promise sections, and looking to incorporate more sections that involve Dual Enrollment students. In addition, the team will be making big strides in the Math Department in the upcoming semesters and is working to set up Z-Degrees and Z-Certificates. There will be more information coming soon, including upcoming data on the Fall 2022 ZTC Student Survey that was conducted in November 2022. There is still work to do! Faculty who would like to learn about becoming involved in this work can reach OER/ZTC Coordinator, Sarah Harmon.




PTK Fall Semester Toy Drive

Our student honor society, Phi Theta Kappa (PTK), recently shared the results of its service project for the holiday. This year's theme of service stemmed from a PTK member who shared his personal experience as a child from a lower socio-economic background. He shared how the toys and games that he received each year through a toy donation event improved his feelings of self-worth and general motivation. With this serving as inspiration, the Chapter collaborated with the Redwood City Fire & Police Departments for their annual Holiday Toy and Book Drive. During the Toy Drive, the Chapter placed large donation barrels in high-traffic areas of campus such as the Cafeteria and the Office of Student Life & Leadership Development. They also decorated a holiday tree in PTK colors to attract attention to the barrels. Students. faculty, staff and community members were invited to donate and the opportunity was promoted through fliers, social media posts and email announcements through the Cañada Marketing Department. As a result of their efforts, PTK students collected enough toys and books to fill three large barrels! The barrels were picked up by the Redwood City Police Department on the last day of the semester and the items where shared with children before December 25. Congratulations to our PTK Chapter on a successful collaboration with the Redwood City Fire & Police Departments and for serving as an inspiration to the college community.
