### **Boys & Girls Clubs of the Peninsula MOU Update**

Last semester I shared with the campus community the MOU that signified the start of the next level in our partnership with the College and the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Peninsula (BGCP). This elevated partnership renews existing commitments that build a seamless pathway for middle school, high school and college students in Southern San Mateo County. Since the October 2023 signing ceremony, great work has been done between Cañada College and BGCP, including expanded Dual Enrollment college courses for students taught at the East Palo Alto Clubhouse, developing a Winter Camp for 80 BGCP middle school students hosted at the College, planning for summer sessions with approximately 250 BGCP high school students also hosted at Cañada College, and shared office space on each other's campus/Clubhouse, providing for special programs, events and resources. When walking campus this week I was delighted to see Adjunct Faculty member and BGCP staff member, Jaime Barajas, connecting with students. I look forward to the continued development of this partnership that benefits youth in our community.

Despite the obstacles, Andres persevered, completed ESL classes, and chose to major in Computer Science. Overcoming the challenges of the required courses, he earned multiple degrees and successfully transferred to San Francisco State.
