Dear Cañada Colleagues,

WebSMART Outage: May 24–27

District Communications shared the following message earlier this week regarding the upcoming maintenance period that will affect WebSMART systems over the Memorial Day holiday weekend from 9 p.m. on May 24 through May 27. This downtime is necessary to align our district information systems with the requirements of the FAFSA Simplification Act.

During this maintenance window, several functionalities will be temporarily unavailable that may impact the following groups:

- Faculty: Grade entry will not be available. With spring grades due on June 3, faculty are encouraged to plan ahead to enter grades either before or immediately after the holiday weekend to meet that deadline.
- Staff: Banner will be unavailable.
- Students: Certain services will be suspended, including Drop for Non-Payment, Waitlist Movement, Course Registration, and Summer Course Cancellation.

We apologize for any inconvenience this downtime may cause and appreciate your understanding.

Staff Support Needed for Commencement

Cañada's 56th Commencement Ceremony will be held on Saturday, May 25 at 10 a.m. and there are a number of opportunities for staff to participate and help make this event a memorable one for our graduates and their families. To assist with this special event, please click the commencement job assignment link.

We do need additional signups for the following Commencement Assignments. Employees can sign up for more than one assignment:

- Super Setter (6:30-7:30 a.m.) Set up signage for The Grove Check-In for graduates. Put out steamers, pins, registration boxes, and bring all water bottles and cupcakes to Lower Lawn Reception. Then help out on the Upper Lawn to label ADA Seating.
- Usher (8:30-10:30 a.m.) Help welcome all guests, guide ADA family members to ADA seating, guide VIP to seating (VIP seats labeled). When the ceremony starts, help ensure no loved ones are entering the student section.
- Graduate Prepper (8:45-10 a.m.) Support grads by steaming sashes and gowns, pinning motor boards on heads.
- Reception Crew (10:15 a.m.-12:15 p.m.) Encourage loved ones to wait until after the ceremony to grab refreshments. After ceremony, help pass out desserts and refreshments.
- Clean-Up Crew (12-1 p.m.) Help organize supplies and put everything away.

Staff support on this day makes the graduation experience for students possible. Important: CSEA employees working at the Commencement ceremony are entitled to overtime compensation. This overtime must be preapproved by the employee's supervisor. Once approved, the employee may choose to receive either overtime pay or compensatory (comp) time. We hope staff will be a part of the Cañada Commencement team and appreciate your consideration.








Show Some Love for the Class of 2024 with Custom Zoom Backgrounds!


