Community at Cañada College

Summer 2025

This summer, Cañada College partnered with local organizations to deliver programs, events and initiatives, held on campus, to strengthen community ties, expand access to education and give students a firsthand look at life as a college student. This work aligns with our EMP Goal 3.2 to strengthen ties to our BIPOC community in North Fair Oaks, Belle Haven and East Palo Alto. From large-scale public events to targeted student outreach, these efforts reflect the College's ongoing commitment to meeting the needs of the communities we serve.

Boys & Girls Club of the Peninsula (BGCP)

Cañada, through its MOU with Boys & Girls Club of the Peninsula, hosted summer programs introducing underserved students to college life. Over 40 middle schoolers, 170 high schoolers and 400 staff participated in career workshops, college readiness activities, leadership sessions, tours and program presentations.



Pal Center

Cañada partnered with the Pal Center to pilot a program for 26 Redwood City middle schoolers, offering interactive sessions led by instructional and support staff. The response was overwhelmingly positive—many students asked to return and said they would recommend the program to friends.
