Dear Cañada Colleagues,

Update on Federal Financial Aid and Executive Order

Earlier this week, SMCCCD District Communications sent a message (attached) clarifying that the January 27 memo (M-25-13) from the Federal Government's Office of Management and Budget (OMB), which announced a "Temporary Pause of Agency Grant, Loan, and Other Financial Assistance," did not impact students' federal financial aid. On January 28, it was announced that the order attempting to freeze federal aid spending had been rescinded. The San Mateo County Community College District and the California Community College Chancellor's Office will continue monitoring federal executive actions, and SMCCCD Communications will provide updates to our community as needed.
