Working in teams of five, students had just 24 hours to conceptualize, design and produce a 30-second animated film based on the theme "Flip Your Perspective." The 24 Hours challenge provides students with the opportunity to conceptualize, design and create an animated sequence while on a very tight deadline, on their own without any faculty assistance. Teams from colleges around the world then had 24 hours to produce their film based on that theme and upload their completed films to the competition site. Digital Art & Animation faculty were on site throughout the challenge to keep an eye on the students and provide emotional support. The completed films from the challenge will be shown as part of the annual Digital Art & Animation Student Show at the end of the Spring semester.
