Cañada's OER/ZTC journey is part of Open Educational Resources Research Case Studies, a collection of case studies exploring how scholars, practitioners and administrators design and implement research on open education. The book, published by DOERS, highlights the ways faculty, staff and institutional leaders across higher education in the United States and Canada investigate the impact of open educational resources and open educational practices on student success. By gathering real-world examples from a wide range of institutional contexts, this collection provides models, insights and shared language to guide others conducting similar research. Cañada's journey has been showcased as a potential model for other colleges, particularly community colleges, as they start up their OER/ZTC programs and increase buy-in from the entire campus community.
