Following the film, there was a lively discussion about what people learned, the importance of the movement and how to grow the inclusiveness exhibited. Interest Area Speaker Series: John Dillard

John Dillard, Cañada College alumnus and currently a water resources engineer, was the featured speaker on Wednesday's Speaker Series where he shared insights on sustainable water management and climate-driven challenges. A graduate of San Jose State University, John has contributed to critical projects like transboundary water conflict analysis in the Apalachicola-Chattahoochee-Flint River Basin and groundwater sustainability initiatives. It was an inspiring evening, hearing about his impactful work and attendees gained valuable knowledge on developing resilient water infrastructure and ensuring equitable access to resources in the face of climate change.





Honors Research Presentation Explores Asian American Experiences

On Thursday, the STAR Program, Honors Transfer Program and Cultural Center collaborated to host the Honors Research Presentation. During the presentation, students shared their incredible research pertaining to the experiences of Asian and Asian-American communities, particularly those in the Bay Area. Students shared their research on forced segregation in Asian American communities, the impact of Covid-19 on hate crimes and mental health and how intersectionality places a role on conflicts in literature. During the presentations, students proposed calls to action to the community to ensure we come together to support each other. This prompted discussion regarding mental health, taking action in local politics and what the Cañada community offers to support our Asian American communities on campus.
