It's also important to <u>file a CARES Report</u>, a confidential way to document concerns or incidents. This helps ensure students receive the support they need. Please contact the <u>CARES Team</u> if:

- There are concerns about personal safety
- A student is displaying signs of acute personal distress
- There is a pattern of disruptive or disturbing behavior

The VPSS Office can help determine the most appropriate path forward.
