Important Updates

Considering Teaching in a New Modality for Summer/Fall 2022 or Spring 2023?

If you are interested in learning to teach in one of our new multi-modal classrooms, and/or converting your class to a different modality, now is the time to get acquainted with the rooms and start considering how you'll need to re-build your course to work in a different modality. Here's what I recommend:

1. Find a few dates and times that are a few weeks away, when you'd be available explore the new room set-ups. Email David Reed, Allison Hughes and John Winchester to find a date and time that works for everyone, and to get a room reserved.
 - a. Review the [Neatboard Guide](#) and/or [Multi-Modal Teaching Room Guide](#) to get familiar with the rooms.
 - b. Review the [DE Modality Definitions](#) and [DE Modality Guidance/Explainer](#) to learn more about what the different modalities entail.
2. After getting an introduction to the hardware in the room and the different modality options, consider which modality would work best for your teaching style and your course.
3. Once your modality has been identified, plan out how to re-design your course to work in this different modality. Re-visit the multi-modal rooms to test things out again and practice using the technology in the rooms as much as needed.

Differences Between the Room Set-Ups

If you're not sure which room set up is best for your students and your course, here are some differences and similarities of each of the rooms

Neatboard Room	Multi-Modal Teaching Room
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Students online can see the students in the room, and vice versa, depending on the location of the Neatboard. o Simpler interface to navigate o Neatboard can be moved o Zoom whiteboard can be written/drawn on with Neatboard stylus 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Better for lecture/teaching classes o Gives students online a better view of what's being written on the whiteboard, if you do that a lot. o Allows you to use the document camera in the room, and share that with students online.
