



Full Time Equivalent Students as a % of All Students (Headcount)




California: all community colleges

California Community Colleges State-wide System FTES as % of All Students (Headcount)




COVID: exacerbating long-term trends

Cañada College Stands Against Racism

Cañada College has made a campus-wide commitment to stand against racism and support Black Lives Matter. The College recognizes the critical need for anti-racist practices, services and teaching in our community. This website provides several campus-wide resources that are dedicated to our commitment.

Emerging Anti-racism Framework & Resources

As a result of three campus-wide Critical Conversations on Race held during the summer 2020, as well as input from the participants in the College Leadership Retreat in August, 2020, the Planning & Budgeting Council (PBC) formed a college-wide Antiracism Task Force in September 2021. On March 17, 2021, the Task Force presented their mid-semester report to PBC. The Task Force is seeking feedback on their progress report from the campus community here. Feedback submitted will help inform and shape their final recommendations to PBC in late April, 2021.
