



Cañada College Fall Term Enrollment Trends: 2019-24




Cañada Student Headcount vs. all California Community Colleges


Conducted this Academic Year



- ✓ Utilize social media and websites to ensure we reach a diverse, inclusive audience
- ✓ Increase dual enrollment opportunities for high school students
- ✓ Triple the number of high school students on campus during the summer and on Saturdays
- ✓ Address food insecurities of our students and their families
- ✓ Increase access to housing resources

Accessible Infrastructure and Innovation


- ✓ Ensure all faculty, staff and students have access to hardware and software technology needed to provide instruction in multiple modalities



Build a **Child Development Center** to serve students with families. (4.2)




