### Communication

Use language to effectively convey an idea or a set of facts, including the accurate use of source material and evidence according to institutional and discipline standards.

### Community, Civic Responsibility, and Ability to Engage with Diverse Perspectives

Understand and interpret various points of view that emerge from a diverse world of peoples and cultures. *Understand the civic duties and obligations as a member of society to participate in the life of their community, society, and the world.*

### Quantitative Reasoning
