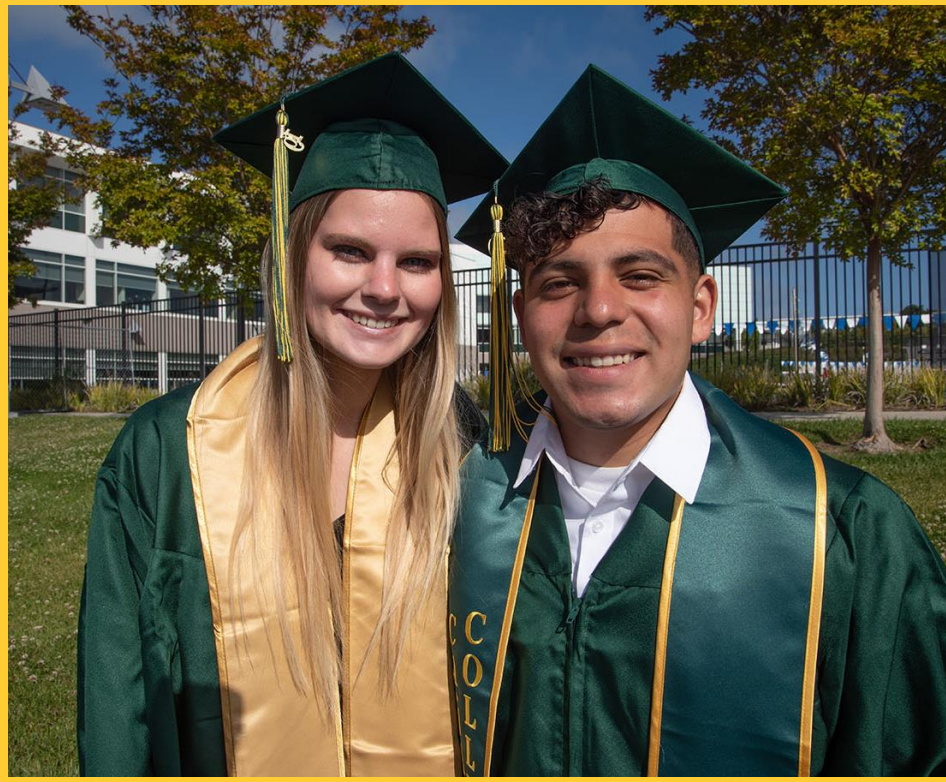

Spring 2026 – Introducing the Career Café by Interest Areas and Career Center

Overview & Purpose:

Career Café by Interest Areas and Career Center is a monthly, community-building career event designed to bring students, faculty, staff, and professionals together over culturally welcoming refreshments such as but not limited to “pandulce” (sweetbread) and coffee/tea.

This space encourages informal career conversations, networking, and student engagement.

Goals of Career Café:

1. Create a culturally welcoming and inclusive space where students can explore career pathways.
2. Strengthen relationships between students, faculty, staff, and external partners (industry professionals, community organizations, alumni).
3. Encourage authentic low-stakes career conversations and networking.
4. Promote visibility of Interest Areas, IA peer mentors, campus wide career courses, and the Career Center resources.

- Services offered:
 - Career readiness support (Resume, Cover Letter, LinkedIn, etc...)
 - Career exploration tools and assessments
 - Job & internship search resources (College Central Network)
 - Student support within each Interest Area

These drop-ins function as continuous student support throughout the semester.

Spring 2026 – Monthly Workshops

Career Readiness Workshops (Monthly, Tuesdays)

Workshops will not occur during Career Café events—they are separate and will still be on Tuesdays.

“Career Pathways Series” (1 hour) can run during weekly drop-ins and may include:

- Résumé Basics
- LinkedIn for Beginners
- Career Exploration Mini-Sessions
- Networking 101
- Career Conversations
- Interview Prep
- Finding Internships & Work-Based Learning

Interest Area Specific Workshops (Monthly, TBD)

- Pre-Health, Pre-Med, Rad Tech
- Fashion Design and Digital Art
- Etc.
