ILO Assessment

Cañada College regularly assesses its Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs) in order to assure institutional effectiveness and promote continuous improvement.

The College uses multiple methods of assessment:

- 1. A survey of students petitioning to graduate with a degree or certificate every year.
- The Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) every two years.
- 3. Program Learning Outcomes Assessments aligned with ILOs.

The results of these assessments are discussed by our participatory governance bodies, including the Planning & Budgeting Council, and appropriate action plans are developed.

 - Female completers slightly more likely to respond than male completers
 - Degree completers were more likely to respond than those earning a Certificate and no Degree
 - Older completers more likely to respond than younger completers




Type of Awards Earned by all Completers


Median Units Earned by Cañada Degree Completers

Please describe any obstacles you experienced while working towards your educational goals at Cañada College.

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Cañada College.	

I formed my own family and couldn't continue my studies.

The Covid pandemic disrupted the entire learning format. Although it was much more convenient not to commute to campus (and saved time, gas), the interaction between classmates online was far less satisfactory than in person. The classroom setting provides a much more interactive environment for questions and perspectives.

My online art related coursework would have benefited from in-person instruction and correction. With the online format, assignments that normally required physical presentations (such as mood boards) were shifted to electronic versions which were convenient and less costly.

One of my greatest obstacles I experienced while working towards my education at Canada was the death of my dad, followed by Covid and learning how to use Zoom and accept that in person studies had forever changed.

There was a time that I had to work full time and studying at same time and also passing for one health issue, but everything turned out okay and I was proud of myself after all.

Managing my time was my first obstacles and dealing with life in general is what haulted my ability to finish college successfully in my early years.

I've been simultaneously working and in classes and there is an element of busywork in online classes I do not appreciate. The and back-and-forth posting reposting is a huge waste of time. Huge. I understand that professors want to pretend that it's "interactiveâ€Љut it's not. It's wasted time, effort and energy. Either schedule a Zoom discussion or let it go. There should be more in-person class times for that. I did my practicum class as a hybrid and it was MUCH better. Only a few in-person meet ups and it felt much more interactive.

the obstacles I've experienced were mostly self-inflicted, time management was the most prevalent. I have a learning disability and therefore I joined the DRC program on campus, which provided with the resources and the kind of counseling I needed in order to carry on and move forward.

I have emailed 3 times (twice to canbusiness@smccd.edu and once to (another staff member)) to express that I am one course short (CBOT 476) from being able to complete 2 additional degrees: Administrative Assistant (AS) and Administrative Support Assistant (AS). This course has been unavailable since at least Fall of 2023, and is still unavailable through Fall of 2024 from all SMCCD campuses. I have asked for guidance on what can be done in order to complete the degree but received no reply to any of my emails. I am frustrated because I still want to earn those degrees and feel they will be beneficial for my career goals, but have been unable to get an answer. I work over 40 hours a week, attend online classes full time and care for my one year old daughter. It is very difficult to be able to get down to the campus, but it feels like the only way I will receive a response is if I am physically there in person to make it so I cannot be ignored.

As an online learner due to my location, it was difficult to feel like a part of the school. I was unable to participate in anything beyond the classroom. It was also difficult to communicate with administrators.

As a single mother of four, I had many obstacles that I experience while working towards my educational goals at Cañada College.
This current semester I received bad news that my mother was diagnosed with cancer. I was facing a very serious obstacle but I
immediately knew that Cañada College has amazing support groups and amazing staff: Thanks to all the support I got from Cañada I
was able to continue with my educational goals.

I haven't experience any obstacles during I was working to get my educational goals.

reduction of synchronous online classes

Overall I had a great experience. The only obstacle here and there was the price of the required materials for some classes.
When I registered for Math 200. The course came with included materials, the problem is that we never used those materials and the professor did not made the class aware of the changed. By the time the professor told us that the materials weren't needed it was too late to opt out for the materials.

Working full-time and going to school was difficult. Canada College had great online and evening classes that allowed me to continue to work.
Trying to get a certificate and take care of young children is very challenging because of the weird class hour schedules. Online classes helped a lot but in this course online tuition is not available.
Obstacles I faced while working towards my educational goals, would be just over life. Having to work, be a single mom and trying to reach my education goal was a lot of work and balance.
Many task and barriers in the expression of my ideas in English. Since my first language is Spanish
Work and balancing children.
The obstacles I experienced where those I brought to myself. I was on and off school for a while dealing with situations outside of school. This made challenging to complete my AA-T on time.
Due to previous educational history with the district, I had to go through several appeals to set up proper foundations for myself this time around in my return to higher education. Financial aid reinstatement and appeal to be reinstated into the student body were a couple that needed to submitted which allowed me to really ground myself in my "why" for coming back.

I think one obstacle was getting the hang of online learning as I have never done it before and the concepts were new to me. Also, getting back in school after many years off!

Big obstacles were the bus schedules and early math semesters

Most of my obstacles were just my disabilities and my living situations of being homeless and domestic violence and things outside of school those are all my obstacles but because of the awesome team and family here on campus I was able to get to my goal and so I'm excited for this next part of my journey

When it came to the faculty in regards to substitute course petition and other things, it was difficult depending on which person was helping me. Some people have a kind and attentive attitude other people act like it's a chore pushing me elsewhere. This mix of attitudes makes it very hard to reach out to the public resources that are available. One counselor in particular had me in tears out of frustration because I was asking for help in understanding an email. She kept repeating the email back to me in a tone that was far from kind, like I was an idiot. I came to her for help and left with a panic attack.

It's hard to be full time student when you're a parent and poor. But canada college has so many resources that help ease the struggles.

Time, language

I faced no major obstacles while attending Canada college. Working and going to school was my biggest challenge. Maybe more job and career fairs for students to get jobs that are flexible with their hours.

Some obstacles I faced was childcare and managing to maintain myself while going to school.

English is my second language and I take more time doing homeworks

Not someone showing me and then tell me to go and read. When someone is in the system and knows how to navigate it's easier for them to know what aligns with what.

Due to my chronic illness I missed a lot of school and my undiagnosed ADHD was also causing me to lose focus in school.

My main obstacles where the difficulty in access services throughout campus, as it took forever to get appointments and when I did the staff weren't always all that competent or kind.
Keeping track of very important events, like when to apply for transfer, while also keeping track of assignment due dates. There are also the time of writing multiple essays when tight on schedules.
No obstacles
The main obstacle was myself, in managing my time and expectations.
Covid-19 was a major hurdle to overcome. Working while in school was similarly challenging.
not being informed on time about the different graduation events and how each department has their own graduation and certificate. Transition from high school to college could be better.
Grammar was not easy at first year.

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Initially I was not able to manage my time and money efficiently as much as I do now.

I come from a first-gen background, so everything about college was new to me. In high school, I had no control over my classes so it was a challenge to be thrown into a place where I can decide my classes and my plans. I was given a lot of support by the college and through my interactions with the community I was given valuable opportunities to grow and get accustomed to higher education.

Financial hardship at times, and was ineligible for any FAFSA, due to having already earned another degree many years ago.

Trying to be more social with other I was afraid . But then it help me when I began doing online classes I learned a lot from my ECE courses that I took which help me really engaged in my job know as a preschool assistant teacher

Trying to figure out my complete educational plan and choose my next step after graduation. I had to change my major after two semesters because I did not know I could not use my initial major to transfer. I wished my previous counselor would discuss and let me know more from the beginning about what I can do after graduation so that we can figure out the right plan.

There was no obstacles for me here in Cañada.

Some teachers were not at all supportive of Students. Teachers are unorganized and barely grade anything throughout the semester. Many classes are unrealistically difficult. Teachers do not take into account that students have lives outside of school. I learned a lot of content at this school, but no skills on how to succeed in university. Some courses are great with wonderful teachers, but overall the courses are out dated and the teachers are very negative. I felt as if i was drowning with no help from my professors for a majority of my classes here. The middle college teachers are also the rudest people and teachers i have ever met. I have never felt more discouraged and pushed down by these teachers, even though i was kind and respectful with all As. It is unacceptable how little they care for their students and speak to them.

Please describe any obstacles you experienced while working towards your educational goals at Cañada College.
Getting my credits transferred but I have received them and are moving forward.
The main obstacle I faced was that there were no morning lab classes for the labs that I wanted to take. I played baseball for Canada College and we practiced at 1, and all of the lab times were also in the afternoon. It would be helpful to future stem majors that also play sports to have more morning class times.
Being an international student, the most difficult part of being at this college was having to pay a high amount of tuition fees. Althoug we are international students, we have difficulty meeting our financial obligations. Also there are not enough financial resources available to international students. Local students have EOPS, calfresh and FAFSA to help with their finishing needs. Overall Cañada is great place to study
i started around the middle, or close to the end of the COVID-19 pandemic (around 2021) so there were obviously some troubles with having only online classes. I had to switch majors my first semester, so it took a bit more time to get everything completed.
COVID made my first few semesters difficult, which is why it took 3 years to get my associates instead of 2 years.
Not many opportunities for online students
I had several issues with financial aid due to not being a CA resident and then for excess credits. This made tuition much more expensive but thankfully, I had savings and scholarships that helped a ton.


I'm not sure there's just one! My program had some off-campus learning opportunities at industry vendors that were awesome. We got to make real-life connections with people working in design.
