Discipline & Transfer Awareness Extra Credit Assignment PILOT RESULTS MUS 202

About 1/3 of the class did this extra credit assignment.

Sample reactions:

- This was a cool extra credit assignment to do. Especially at the end of the semester, it shows what we can do with this information we have studied for the entire class and how we can continue to study it at the next level of schooling when we do transfer from junior college. It also helped me get a better idea of how to find more information for California schools, and seeing what a vast range of studies many of them have.
