Instructional & Administrative Annual Update Questions

1. Changes & Updates: The college is currently in year five of a five-year implementation plan for Guided Pathways. The ending of several large grants that provided primary funding for services including peer tutoring, peer mentoring, embedded tutoring and other student support programs in the STEM and Learning Centers necessitate a realignment of positions and funding to support Guided Pathways implementation. A revised Director of Student Support position will lead operations in the Learning Center as well as oversee components of Interest Area and Success Team coordination. The request for two Retention Specialist positions, one Office Assistant II position, and one EPIC Coordinator position are related to this overall realignment and program growth.

3. Rationale for New Goals: As the Learning Center takes on a more central role in supporting Guided Pathways implementation, and as the one year extension of the GANAS grant winds down, the need to plan for staffing and support of new and expanded programs is paramount. Examples of programs that need to shift from grants to more stable funding include the peer mentoring program, the EPIC program (embedded tutoring and supplemental instruction), and areas of peer tutoring that have also been grant funded in the STEM area. The new supports needed related to Guided Pathways include supporting Interest Area Success Teams with a scaled up retention program and related additional positions.

Annual Update Status: In Process

Goal Description: Integration and institutionalization of STEM programs and services within the Learning Center

All STEM tutoring and EPIC programming and positions are grant-funded. The no-cost extension for the GANAS grant is set to expire on June 30, 2022. However, institutionalization is built into the grant funding and it is necessary to plan for the support of these currently grant-funded positions that are required to lead essential tutoring and learning assistance programs, such as EPIC/Embedded tutoring and other STEM-originated programs and services.
